6'-14'	Caragana	<i>Caragana arborescens</i>	Good	Good	Very hardy, yellow flowers, produces pods
6'-10'	Cherry, Black	<i>Prunus serotina</i>	Fair	Excellent	Dark edible fruits in the fall

35'-65'	Ash, Green	<i>Fraxinus pennsylvanica</i>	Good	Fair	Popular for single row belts, long lived
25'-60'	Aspen, Quaking	<i>Populus tremuloides</i>	Good	Good	Long lived, Native, fast growing
30'-60'	Boxelder	<i>Acer negundo</i>	Poor	Fair	Likes moisture, easily injured by 2-4D
25'-40'	Buckeye, Ohio	<i>Aesculus glabra</i>	Poor	Fair	Candle like flowers, large globose fruit
30'-45'	Black, Cherry	<i>Prunus serotina</i>	Fair	Excellent	Leaves are shiny, long and narrow
50'-99'	Cottonwood, Native	<i>Populus deltoides</i>	Good	Fair	Fast growing, Native, bright yellow fall color
30'-50'	Cottonwood, Siouxland	<i>Populus deltoides</i>	Poor	Fair	Cottonless, like moisture
10'-25'	Crabapple, Dalgo	<i>Malus</i>	Good	Excellent	Showy flowers, and wildlife food source
10'-25'	Crabapple, Midwest	<i>Malus spp</i>	Good	Excellent	Hardy, fruit stays on all winter
10'-25'	Crabapple, Siberian	<i>Malus baccata</i>	Good	Good	Hardy, rapid growth white flowers
40'-60'	Hackberry, Oahe	<i>Celtis occidentalis</i>	Poor	Good	Fall coloration, often damaged by wildlife
15'-20'	Hawthorn, Arnold	<i>Crataegus x anomala</i>	Good	Excellent	Dark glossy green, yellow fall color
30'-45'	Linden, Little Leaf	<i>Tilia cordata</i>	Poor	Poor	Flowers and fruits farmstead windbreak
15'-20'	Maple, Amur	<i>Acer ginnala</i>	Poor	Fair	Bright reddish fall color, Native
45'-65'	Elm, American	<i>Ulmus americana</i>	Good	Excellent	Native, vase shape
15'-20'	Maple, Silver	<i>Acer saccharinum</i>	Poor	Fair	Fast growing, likes moisture, good shade
40'-70'	Oak, Bur	<i>Quercus macrocarpa</i>	Good	Excellent	Long lived, acorns, excellent shade tree
25'-35'	Pear, Ussarian/ McDermand	<i>Pyrus ussuriensis</i>	Fair	Good	White flowers, excellent fruit
40'-60'	Poplar, Hybrid	<i>Populus hybrids</i>	Poor	Good	Fast growing, likes moisture
35'-60'	Walnut, Black	<i>Juglans nigra</i>	Poor	Good	Highly prized wood, shed nuts
40'-65'	Willow, Laurel	<i>Salix alba vitellina</i>	Poor	Good	Fast growing, likes moisture

30'-45'	Cedar, Eastern Red	<i>Juniperus virginiana</i>	Good	Excellent	1/6" needles, reddish-brown in winter
30'-60'	Larch, Siberian	<i>Larix sibirica</i>	Poor	Poor	1 1/2" needles, yellow in winter
20'-40'	Juniper, Rocky Mountain	<i>Juniperus Scopulorum</i>	Good	Excellent	1/6" needles, hardy, green year- round
50'-70'	Pine, Ponderosa	<i>Pinus ponderosa</i>	Good	Fair	4-7" needle, good for single row belts
25'-50'	Pine, Scotch	<i>Pinus sylvestris</i>	Fair	Fair	2" needles
30'-60'	Spruce, Black Hills	<i>Picea glauca var. densata</i>	Fair	Good	1/2-3/4" needles, ornamental
30'-60'	Spruce, Colorado Blue	<i>Picea pungens</i>	Fair	Good	1" needle, branches to ground
